Let's Celebrate Midsummer's Eve! La oss feire sankthansaften!

The first day of summer this year, the summer solstice, is officially Monday, June 21, 1999. Sunday, June 20, is Midsummer's Eve, an event celebrated in all of Scandinavia and much of Northern Europe. In most parts of Norway the sun shines for 24 hours on this day, a welcome relief after months of winter darkness.

Norwegians for centuries, as well as the old Norse before them, have celebrated this day with festivities. The pagan Norse honored the sun believing that if it would not turn in the right direction humanity would be doomed to perish. It is on this day that trolls and witches were said to roam freely, so bonfires were lit to drive them away and give renewed power to the sun. After Christianity came to Norway around 1000 AD, the midsummer celebrations continued as a religious holiday honoring the birth of John the Baptist. The day was referred to as **jonsok**, St John's Eve, or **sankthans**, St Hans Eve.

Today many celebrations feature bonfires on beaches and there are usually some folks in troll costumes but the emphasis is on celebrating the light summer nights and the life outdoors (**friluftsliv**). Modern midsummer celebrations feature outdoor candles or torches instead of bonfires; music and dancing with a guitar or accordion; a sing-along; and good food (god mat) such as **rømmegrøt**, **kjøttpålegg** (cøutt-paw-legg; cold cuts), **svenskabrød** og **flatbrød**. The kids like to make campfire bread (**pinnebrød**).

Jonsok (Midsummer) Superstitions

If you place seven types of flowers under your pillow on Midsummer, you will dream of the one you will marry.

If your livestock eat grass that was picked at midnight on **jonsok**, they will not fall ill the rest of the year.

Slik jonsokværet er, blit sommeren. (Such as jonsok weather is, the summer stays).

The weather for the rest of the summer will be like it is on **jonsok**.

Jonsok rain means an early fall.

Pinnebrød (Campfire Bread)

2¼ cup flour
2 tsp salt
2 tsp baking powder
1 cup water

Blend together all dry ingredients and then add the water. Knead the dough. Use enough flour to keep it from becoming sticky. Roll the dough into the shape and size of a hotdog and attach it to a stick. Grill it over a campfire. The bread is finished when it turns light brown and the dough can be easily pulled from the stick. Eat the bread with a hotdog or else butter it and add a topping such as cinnamon or sugar.
